Harvest Home Fair

The first Harvest Home Fair dates back to the 1860s when a farmer had a fair for his harvesting on over 60 acres of land he purchased in Green Township. The Fair has been run by the Kiwanis Club of Cheviot since 1939 when it assumed full leadership. With over **23 Committees**, planning begins in early February. Each Kiwanian is expected to donate at least **16 hours** during the fair. However each member usually puts in the time to make the fair as big of a success as the years prior. An estimated **16,000 man hours** is contributed each year to the fair by its committee and their families.



The parade starts on Thurs., Sept. 7 at 6 pm. Be sure to enter one of the many contests including art show and flower show salsa-beer-chili, homemade wines, baking, hobby, needlework, canning, and fruits & vegetables. Over \$2,000 in the general exhibition prizes and no entry fee. Saturday's entertainment includes Nick Netherton 4-6:30 pm and Marsha Brady 7:30 pm-11pm. Save Taxes on Qualified Home Improvements

City Council recently passed an ordinance to create a Residential Community Reinvestment Area (CRA) Tax Abatement Program. Any residential property owner in Cheviot may be eligible for the abatement if they make major improvements to their property of a scale that requires a building permit. For 1 & 2-family homes, the abatement is 100% of the increased value for 10 years. Residences with 3 or more units can receive a 100% abatement of the increased value for 12 years. Note that the abatement is only for the **increased** valuation of the property. The County Auditor makes the final determination of the value of the improvement. Applications are available at the Building Dept. at City Hall. Hours are: Wed. 7pm-9pm and Sat. 9am-noon.
