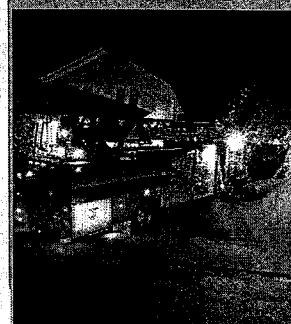

2018 Statistics

The Cheviot Fire Division

responded to 426 fire runs. The total fire loss was estimated to be \$74,538.00

The Cheviot Division of EMS

responded to 1383 emergency medical calls. Revenue generated from EMS billing for 2018 was approximately \$200,000.00

The Cheviot Training Division

logged over 1170 hours of training that included joint operations with local area departments.

The Cheviot Fire Prevention

Division conducted 163 fire inspections, installed 97 car seats, held 88 prevention activities including the Cheviot Family Day Picnic, Bicentennial Events, and Parades. Seven new business occupancy permits were issued.



The City lost Retired Fire Chief William Owens in October. Chief Owens began his career in 1966 as a part-time firefighter and progressed through the ranks to become Chief in 1985. Chief Owens retired in 1993.
