During the 3rd quarter of 2018, The Cheviot Police Department activity included:

Our department received 1321 calls for service in the 3rd quarter from the Hamilton County Communications Center. Not included in that number were 601 self / non billed details for a total of 1922 responses for service. Officers made a total of 3595 entries, for the third quarter, into our Pamet reporting system. These additional entries represent extra assignments, building checks, vacation checks, business checks, directed patrol, warrant service etc.
