During the 2nd quarter of 2018, The Cheviot Police Department activity included:

Our department received 1372 calls for service in the 2nd quarter from the Hamilton County Communications Center. Not included in that number were 572 self-initiated / non billed details for a total of 1944 responses for service. Officers made a total of 3529 entries, for the first quarter, into our Pamet reporting system. These additional entries represent extra jobs, building checks, vacation checks, business checks, directed patrol etc.
