Re: Year-end Police Department Report

During the calendar year of 2023, The Cheviot Police Department received 6049 calls for service from the Hamilton County Communications Center. Not included in that number were 2884 self-initiated/ non-billed details for a total of 8933 dispatcher related responses for service. Officers logged a total of 19630 entries for the year 2022 into our Sundance reporting system. These entries represent extra jobs, building checks, vacation checks, business checks, self-initiated details, details called into the station, directed patrols etc. Officers also made 1719 traffic stops or self-initiated contacts.
