ORDINANCE NO. 24-14

**TO INCREASE THE PAY RATE FOR CERTAIN CITY EMPLOYEES; AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY.**

**WHEREAS**, by Ordinance 22-14, this Council established certain wage rates for part-time Maintenance Department employees; and


**WHEREAS**, this Council has determined that an hourly rate increase for said employees is necessary to allow the City to remain competitive in its pay rates.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHEVIOT, STATE OF OHIO, TWO-THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF CONCURRING, THAT:**


Section 1. The wage rates of part-time employees of the Maintenance Department shall be \$13.00/hour to \$16.50/hour, depending on the length of time in the position and demonstration of skill and ability to perform the duties of the job. The employee's wage rate shall be determined by and at the discretion of the Mayor within the range set forth herein.

Section 2. The wage increases in this Ordinance shall be effective as of June 1, 2024 and shall remain in effect unless modified by this Council.


Section 3. This Ordinance shall be an emergency measure for the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Cheviot and shall take effect immediately. The emergency is necessary in order to allow the City to remain competitive in attracting and keeping the best qualified part-time employees, as well as to update the pay rates for the upcoming pay periods.




Stephanie Hawk suggested that we add the specification that says the city flag poles are not intended to serve as an open form for free expression by the public.
