Reports of Standing Committees: No reports were presented

Public Recognition: There was no public recognition on agenda items.

LEGISLATION:

No legislation was presented to council.

Administrative Reports:

-Mayor Keller reported that the city is applying for a grant from NatureWorks. The grant will be for \$150K, which is earmarked for renovation of a baseball field at Harvest Home Park. The grant is a 25% match from the City (\$37,500)

-Safety Service Director Braun reported that the preconstruction meeting for the Harvest Home Road Project was held. Construction is expected to begin in early July and completed in 4 to 5 weeks. House Bill 184 affecting ORC 9.66 which would restrict public disclosure of specific economic development projects was discussed. SSD is awaiting legal review from the law director that will affect new projects for the city.

-Law Director Rohr was not present but messaged that she is working on snow and parking legislation.

Public Recognition on Other Issues: No one from the public asked for recognition

Old Business: None

New Business:

-Discussion centered around a property at the corner of North Bend and Hilda where several large appliances have been left in the front yard. Mr. Morgan stated that he understood that the tenant of the building had moved. The items may have been moved since last weekend, but that couldn't be confirmed. Mrs. Richter also stated that there is a dead tree on the property that is posing a safety risk to passers-by. The property has been cited for a grass violation.

-Reminder that Family Day is tomorrow, June 3. Mrs. Richter asks for all of council to participate in some way.

Correspondence:

-A resident on Nolan Ave reported that he felt the tall grass notice he received was a result of the recent road work on that street that had left his yard in a condition where mowing would be problematic.
