LEGISLATION:

Resolution 26-06 Resolution of Necessity To Move Forward With Placing a 3.00 Mil Tax Renewal Levy in Excess Of The 10 Mil Limitation On The November 3, 2026 General Election Ballot. Introduced by Ms. Borgmann, second by Mr. Watt. Motion to adopt made by Mr. Morgan, second by Ms. Borgmann. (Resolution passed by title only. Mrs. Rohr will prepare the legislation for the July 7 meeting)

Resolution 26-07 To Authorize Application For A NatureWorks grant. Introduced by Mr. Morgan, second by Mr. Petermann. Motion for adoption made by Ms. Borgmann, second by Mr. Borgmann.

Administrative Reports:

-Mayor Keller is consulting with the engineer's office concerning remediation of an ongoing drainage issue at a property on Glenmore Avenue.

-Safety Service Director Braun reported that a resolution will be needed to participate in the Opportunity Zone program through Hamilton County. This program will make the city eligible for

federal funding for certain projects within the city. Washington Avenue has been recommended for Municipal Road Fund monies.

-Law Director Rohr discussed the steps necessary to get the tax renewal levy on the November ballot. The first step was to create a Resolution of Necessity (see RES 26-06 adopted by title). She will prepare the legislation for signatures for the July 7 meeting).

spoke with council regarding adopting a "Do Not Knock" ordinance due to many complaints from residents about door to door contacts made recently. Mrs. Rohr suggested that additional research be done to give such an ordinance some ramifications for non-compliance.

New Business:

-Ms. Hawk questioned if there could be a "Do Not Knock" list similar to the one used in Green Township. This is due to several complaints from residents about recent door-to-door canvassers. Mrs. Rohr suggested creating new legislation that would contain ramifications for the companies who do not comply. This is referred to Mr. Petermann's Laws, Rules & Ordinances Committee, which will meet following the council meeting on July 21.
